**Location:** Goethe State Forest, Tidewater Trailhead, Dunnellon, FL, CR 337 and 336

**Registration and Vet-in will** take place 3-5 pm on Friday. 25 mile riders may vet in Saturday

**Terrain:** Trails are mostly packed sand forest roads with a mixture of gravel roads. May be sections of water. Hoof protection is suggested for the 50. Will be riding the only the designated marked trails for this event.

**Awards:** Completion, top 10, first place, best condition.

**Entry Fees:** 25 or 50 mile - \$110 Juniors- \$55

**Directions: From the North:** I-75 South to exit # 382, Turn south (right) towards Williston, go 16.5 miles to stop sign and turn left, continue on 121/ US 41. Go to Stoplight, turn right, continue on 121. Go to stoplight- turn left, continue on 121. Go to next stop light - turn right and continue on 121 another 16 miles. Turn left on CR 337, go 6 miles- Tidewater trailhead entrance will be on your left.

**From the South:** I-75 North to exit # 341, Belleville/Dunnellon. Turn left on CR 484 toward Dunnellon. In Dunnellon, cross Hwy 41 at light and go to stop sign and turn right, continue on CR 40. Go another 4 miles and turn right on CR 336. Go 5.6 miles and turn right on 337, go ¼ mile and turn right into the Tidewater trailhead entrance.

## **Covid plan for Winter Gallop @ Tidewater Ride**

Riders please do NOT attend if showing signs of illness to include, but not limited to, fever, cough, chills, nausea, vomiting, diarrhea, or loss of sense of smell or taste.

Signs will be posted as you enter camp and in common areas to remind you to social distance.

The ride will be limited to 50 horses.

All riders must pre enter and prepay in advance.

Riders please come prepared - Bring all your own food and drinks. We will not be serving any food or drinks to the riders.

In trying to keep our numbers down, do not invite friends and family to attend the ride.

We will also keep the volunteers to a minimum so please be patient with us.

Use your own trailer restrooms when possible.

There will be no overnight camping. Vetting on Friday and then drive in on Saturday.

Management will have rider packets with the ride instructions for riders. We will offer a brief ride meeting for anyone with questions or newer riders.

Awards will be given after the rider vets through for their completion.

All areas where lines could form with horses will be monitored for Social Distancing.

All horses will present to the vet by only one handler. Anytime a person will be closer than 6 feet, they will wear face covering.

*Sanitizing* – Veterinarians will be sanitizing their hands regularly while vetting. While this takes just a moment, riders should remain patiently in line until called forward by the veterinarian. Restrooms will have soap and water (or hand sanitizer) and riders will be encouraged to wash hands when possible. Ride management will provide sanitizer in common areas.

It is each person's responsibility to take care of themselves and be vigilant of social distancing.

Plan is subject to change according to state mandates and Veterinarian discretion.
